"Gimme" Putts (Wayne & Billy & George)

The committee discussed the current policy where players are not required to "hole-out" their putts as long as the position of the ball is "in the leather." There is concern that some players have become lax in following the policy sometimes giving putts that are not "within "the leather."

The committee discussed the following options:

- 1) **NO CHANGE** No change to current policy/practice
- 2) **PUBLISH THE POLICY** Formally publish the policy encouraging players to always measure their putts and to not be overly generous in conceding putts.
- 3) MEASURE OR INCUR A PENALTY Add a penalty to the policy:
 - a) If a player calls their ball "in-the-leather" and picks it up without showing other players it is a "gimme," the player will incur a one-stroke penalty.
 - b) If a player concedes another player's putt without measuring the putt, that player will incur a one-stroke penalty (the player's whose ball was picked up will not incur a penalty but will be given the putt).
- 4) CHANGE THE "GIMME" LENGTH Shorten the length of "gimme" putts to 12 inches, 6 inches or some other shorter distance.
- 5) COMPLETELY CHANGE THE POLICY No "gimme" putts. Hole out all putts

The Steering Committee discussed a change in policy which could go into effect next season (starting November 1, 2020). The new policy under consideration is the elimination of "gimme" putts and requiring players to hole-out all putts.

- This change is being considered due to the fact that many players have become overly generous in conceding putts and are not measuring "gimme" putts.
- The committee agreed that although it is easy to concede putts without measuring this leads to an inconsistent application of the rule which is not fair to other groups.
- We need a policy that is consistent and ensures play is fair for everyone.
- Besides ensuring fairness, no longer measuring putts will eliminate the possibility of damaging the cups while measuring for "in-the-leather."
- It is debatable whether or not holing out all putts will slow down play so . . .
- During the remainder of the season committee members will try the new policy (holing out all putts) to see if it affects the pace of play.
- Also, this testing of the new policy during the next 8 weeks will give all players a chance to provide input before a final decision is made.
